# VILLAGE OF WATERLOO REGULAR MEETING MINUTES April 10, 2012

## **OPEN MEETING**

Chairperson Benke called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm and stated the location of the Open Meetings Act. Notice of the meeting was duly exercised and mailed per the bylaws.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

The meeting was opened for public comments. Dave and LaVerna Edmister, owners of Venice Antiques approached the Board about holding a flea market in Waterloo on May  $19^{th}$  and  $20^{th}$ , and again during Harvest Days, September  $8^{th}$  and  $9^{th}$ . They are also moving their business to Waterloo in the near future. The Board said they didn't have a problem with this, but their request has to be put on the agenda for the next meeting before they can approve it.

#### **REPORTS**

Reports were provided by the following:

**Utilities-**Mike Goddard-PeopleService. Mike discussed the water line that was extended from the old Hamel Manufacturing Building to their new building. According to Waterloo Code, they needed approval from the Village before doing this. They didn't know this and reported it as soon as they found out it was a problem. Our Building Inspector also didn't catch it when he did the plumbing inspection. The Board asked Hert to have the Village Inspector meet with Mike Goddard to discuss this issue.

**Fire & Rescue:** No one present to provide Fire report. Benke said they need the bids for the SUV markings by the next meeting.

**Police**-Donahue provided report.

**Maintenance**-Bednar provided report. Rotert reminded Bednar about contacting Valley about spraying. Rotert said he would like to see the Village get nicer trash cans for downtown Waterloo. Benke asked Bednar if JEO had done right-of-way staking on 240<sup>th</sup> and Blondo Streets. The Board wants to put up signs related to the levee. Bednar said no. Benke asked Dave Henke from JEO to follow-up with the levee project manager at JEO.

**Library-**Report provided. Trustee Harrie said that there's a time capsule buried at the old library that needs to be located and removed before the town sells the library.

**Clerks Report-**Hert provided updates on "Code Red", "Safe Walk to School Projects", the website and OPPD Projects. Rotert asked Hert if the office would take care of setting up the first Planning Board Meeting with the new members.

## DISCUSSION/CONSIDERATION/ACTION

**JEO Invoice:** Motion by Rotert, second by Lee to pay JEO Invoice #68215 for \$1640.00 for the Bank Stabilization Project, with a 50% cost share with the NRD. All in favor, motion carried.

**3rd Street Undercrossing Project**: Dave Henke from JEO Consulting said we can't proceed with this project until we have a signed agreement from U.P. As soon as the fully-executed agreement is received, Hert will contact Henke and JEO can begin outlining the bid specifications.

**Ordinance to change the date pet licenses are due:** Motion by Benke, second by Harrie to table discussion and/or approval of this ordinance until the first meeting in July. All in favor, motion carried.

**Approval of Attorney Invoice:** Motion by Benke, second by Harrie to pay Invoice No. WAT2-Levee for \$513.00 for the Levee Project. All in favor, motion carried.

**CHAIRPERSON'S TOPICS:** Benke reported that Channel 7 wants to interview him about the petition issue that will be on the ballot for the primary election. Benke and the Board agreed to do their NIMS Training before the meeting on April 24<sup>th</sup>.

**TRUSTEES' TOPICS:** Lee mentioned that we may want to require a vendors' license for the flea market, one that would cover all of the vendors. Attorney Bunger agreed that it would be a good idea. Benke asked Hert to contact the Edmisters and let them know.
